Our library and two teaching blocks (Frankland Block and Gaebler Block) were finished during the school holidays. Our purpose built Visual Arts room is part of Frankland Block. Mrs Gilks has worked very hard to set this room up and welcomed her first class of enthusiastic students last Wednesday. Our final sculpture is in place on the lawn area in front of the library. This morning four custom made timber benches have been installed on the lawn area near the sculpture outside the library. This area will be especially for our senior students to use as a quiet meeting or reading area.


The school holidays also saw some exciting developments in stage one of our playground and landscaping project. The 'boat', on the lawn outside Eucalyptus Block, has been explored and admired by all classes. The lawn in and around the boat has now been given the all clear following the maintenance work that was carried out in the second week of the holidays. This means that next week our Year 1, 2 and 3 students will be able to enjoy playing on the 'boat' and drawing on the blackboard that is mounted to the eastern wall of the block!

Our Early Childhood students are thoroughly enjoying their new play equipment. The balance beams and stepping stones that meander through the gardens are very popular. The 'cubby' has become a popular meeting place for students and will be utilised by teachers to encourage creative play and extend the classroom program into the playground. A custom made child size picnic table is moved in and out of the sand pit each day. The children enjoy making sand cakes and cups of tea to share with their friends at the picnic table when they are playing in the sand pit.

Stage two of our playground and landscaping project will begin soon. The Buildings and Grounds Committee will convene again in the next few weeks to make decisions about what comes

next....so watch this space!

Our undercover area will be finished next week. We are looking forward to using this area to hold our first assembly in the coming weeks. This area will also be used for our official opening to be held on June 27 2014.

# **Safety of Students**

The safety of all our students is a priority at all times. ## **NAPLAN**

For Year 3 and 5 students across Australia, *NAPLAN* assessments will take place from tomorrow (Tuesday) to Thursday 15 May. On Tuesday morning the students will complete a forty minute assessment on *Language Conventions* and a forty minute assessment on *Writing*. On Wednesday Year 3 students will complete a forty five minute assessment on *Reading* and the Year 5 students will complete a 50 minute assessment on *Reading*. On Thursday Year 3 students will complete a forty five minute assessment on *Numeracy* and the Year 5 students will complete a fifty minute assessment on *Numeracy*.

Students have been well prepared by their teachers for these assessments. This preparation includes practise with the format, language, response types and time constraints of the test.
