As our school enrolments have increased, we are now in a position for Mrs Hill to be in a full-time administration role as our Associate Principal. In this capacity she will continue to closely monitor the educational program and curriculum provision across all year levels.

I am also very pleased to welcome Mrs Andrea McFadden who has joined the team at Hammond Park Primary School as the form teacher of our Year 4 class. Our Year 5/6 teacher is Ms Jankowska. These two teachers will continue to work together to provide an instructional program that enables all students to work collaboratively and maintain the friendships that have been formed in first semester.

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
Art Exhibition 4 Invitation BOB Flyer


Going by the wonderful stories the students were sharing on the bus ride home, and a few sleepy heads, this excursion was highly successful.


