Kindergarten Enrolment Week

Parents and caregivers of our 2015 Kindy students are invited to finalise their enrolment paperwork this week (Monday 27 October – Friday 31 October). At this time it is important to bring in your child's Birth Certificate, Immunisation Records and proof of your residency with our school's Local Intake Area (a current utilities bill, Immunisation Record, a rental contract or a building contract). When you complete the enrolment procedure you will be given a folder of information that includes School Contributions and Charges, a 2015 Kindergarten Information Booklet and a Uniform Order to help you plan expenditure for the new school year.

Swooping Magpies on our School Oval

Be Aware of Swooping Magpies

Male magpies are territorial and may swoop at people if they think their nest or offspring are being threatened. Be on the lookout for swooping magpies between August and October. Although this can be alarming, in most cases you can continue on your way, the bird will often retreat to a tree and watch until you leave its territory. Do not look towards the swooping bird and ask your children not to throw rocks or sticks at the birds. The Department of Parks and Wildlife encourage people to avoid known swooping areas and find an alternative route during the breeding period, also to encourage the wearing of a broad-brimmed hat and sunglasses to conceal your face and eyes. If swooped while riding a bike consider attaching cable ties to your helmet as a deterrent. Dismounting and walking your bike through the area can also help.

Hammond Park Primary School are very excited to get their next sustainability project up and running. We are going to build three compost bays, funded by the Waste Wise grant, so we can offset our carbon footprint and reduce the amount of waste we send to landfill.

When we conducted our whole school audit we discovered that food scraps made up a large proportion of waste that our school sends to landfill. Unfortunately, food that is sent to landfill rots away producing methane, which is a dangerous greenhouse gas. From November, all of our food scraps will be either feed to our composting worms or placed into the compost bays. Over time it will break down into luscious compost that we can use on our school gardens. This is another way to close the loop on recycling.

We want to make these compost bays using recycled materials. We are looking for star pickets, chicken wire and pallets. If you have any of these items lying around and taking up space, it would be fantastic if you could donate them to the school.

Stay tuned to hear about when we will be holding our Busy Bee. It would be great if you could come and assist with the construction of these compost bays.























Dear Parents and Families
