

Our Foundation Year 2014

As we approach the end of our Foundation Year it is time to reflect on all that has happened in our community since we 'opened for business' in Term one:

- School began for 221 students K Year 6 on Monday 3 February.
- The Administration building, Murrumbidgee Block and Eucalyptus Block were handed over to us three days earlier in a flurry of last minute activity.
- Staff worked long days to set up their classrooms ready for the start of the school year.
- At last our school was operational and our community was pleased that their long awaited school was now a reality.
- Our students looked smart in their brand new Hammond Park uniforms.
- All students shared the one available play area until the Early Childhood playground was finished in week 3 of the term.
- Kapture Photography took some magnificent candid photos of our students at their new school that are displayed daily on the screen in the school office.
- Our ICT journey began with banks of iPads for K 3 students and Macbooks for the Year 4/5/6 students. This journey leads us to our inaugural ICT Expo being held today and tomorrow in all classrooms.
- Our first Wastewise Audit was conducted and the data analysed. Wastewise grants were successful and our first compost bay and worm farms were established yesterday.
- Our P&C Association was launched in Term 2. A team of committed members and volunteers have worked together throughout the year to introduce some interesting fundraising ventures that will be extended in 2015.
- Our Hammond Park Primary Independent Public School Board was established. The Board has endorsed policy, processes and structures that will see our school forge forward in the future.
- OSHClub offer and run before and after school care and now operate from our Undercover Area.
- Our playground landscaping delivered unique and creative play opportunities for all students in all year levels.
- The first stage of our school orchard was planted. We have orange, lemon, lime and olive trees in the orchard.
- Lots of shade trees have been planted and continue to thrive under the expert care of our gardener.



- We have a Visual Arts Specialist Teacher, a Phys-Ed Specialist Teacher and a Drama Teacher.
- We took part in the 'National Simultaneous Storytime' in our new library on 21 May 2014.
- Our first set of formal school photos were taken.
- Year 3 and 5 students sat NAPLAN tests in May.
- Our school was officially opening on 27 June by the Minister for Education.
- Our students love our opening song "Que Sera". They all know and sing two verses of our National Anthem "Advance Australia Fair".
- Our inaugural Faction Athletics Carnival was held in week 3 of Term 4.
- Our factions have names Creo, Laurus, Exulto and Magnus.
- · Magnus was the winning faction this year.
- Teachers took students to lots of interesting places to consolidate learning at school.
- School Banking began in Term 4.
- Our first Year 6 students graduated from primary school to begin their secondary school career.
- Our P&C hosted a celebratory Disco for all students on Friday 5 December. Everyone received a gift from the P&C to acknowledge the end of our Foundation Year.

I am very proud of our school, our students, our teachers and our supportive community. I would also like to acknowledge the hard work of our Business Manager and School Officer who ensure that our school runs efficiently and effectively every day. Our teachers and Education Assistants are highly effective in providing teaching and learning opportunities for each and every student in our school.

We look forward to welcoming new teachers, students and their families to Hammond Park Primary School next year as we continue "Learning Together Every Day" in 2015.

Peninsula Farm Excursion

Last Friday the Year 4, 5 and 6 students attended an excursion at Peninsula Farm (Tranby House) in Maylands. We have been studying the settlement of the Swan River Colony and were lucky enough to be able to visit the original residence of the Hardy Family who settled at Peninsula Farm in 1839.

We had a tour of the original house and learnt how the early settlers lived their daily lives. We also had the opportunity to weigh rations and find out how little food was available for the workers who came out from England with the Hardys. We heard how the settlers communicated and we created letters using cross-writing (a form of writing used to save paper and postage). It is hard to imagine how people kept in contact without modern technology! To finish the day off we did some persuasive sketching.

We had a great day and would recommend a visit to Peninsula Farm to all families.
