How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

iPhone & iPad Users

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "instalf".
- If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
- When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.





Android Users

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" builton on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

Art shirts and portfolios



Artist in Residence Project 2015 'The Red Thread'

This Artist-in-Residence Grants Program project has been assisted by the Federal Government through the Australia Council for the Arts and the Western Australian State Government through the Department of Culture and the Arts and Department of Education.

Dear parents/caregivers,

I am excited to say that our Artist in Residence project has now begun, and what a wonderful start it has been! The children in years 1-6 have responded enthusiastically to the project and have been learning about the local area, as well as the School of St Yared in Ethiopia.

In week 1 Amanda Huxtable came and gave a wonderful presentation to the children about the School of St Yared and what life is like in Ethiopia. The children were astounded to discover how small the houses were that the children were living in, and that many houses shared one tiny kitchen. The news that children in Ethiopia had no TV or chocolate drew a very loud gasp from the students!

In week 2 Leah Napier, local history librarian, gave presentations to each class. She taught the children about the history of Hammond Park. The students were very engaged during her talk and Leah told me what fantastic questions they asked her.

You may also have noticed a new face around the school.....that is our wonderful artist Samantha Hughes. Samantha Hughes is a writer, illustrator and textile artist who has worked with children and young people as a children's librarian in public libraries over the last decade. Her role has involved storytelling, running art and illustration workshops and the promotion of great children's books. We are so lucky to have her working with our students!



Parents, if you haven't yet returned your child's permission note for the Artist in Residence Project, can you please do that as soon as possible? If you have misplaced your note, just ask your child's teacher for a new one. If we don't have the permission note back, then we can't include your child's work in the end of project exhibition.

Kindergarten Applications 2016

Kindergarten applications for those children born between July 1 2011 and June 30 2012 are now open.

Applications should be received at school on or before 31st July 2015.

Thank you to those parents who have already submitted an application for Kindergarten for 2016.

Applications will be processed after 31st July 2015. You will receive a letter from us in relation to your child's application.

Upon acceptance of enrolment the following documentation will be required:

- Birth Certificate or Passport (Visa Number)
- Immunisation details
- Proof of address (eg. Alinta Gas or Synergy account and/or lease agreement/ building contract)
- Copy of Court Orders (if applicable)



Colds— A Message from the School Nurse

Upper respiratory tract infections or colds are everywhere, especially in winter, so it is almost impossible to stop children from catching them. Here are some points which may help:

- Teach your child to cover his/her nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing, and to wash hands straight afterwards.
- Hands should be washed after blowing noses and before eating.
- Use tissues once and then throw them in the bin. (Avoid using handkerchiefs.)
- Keep your child home from school if he/she has a cold/cough/fever/pain.
- Make sure that your children eat a balanced diet of plenty of healthy foods.
- Keep children away from smoke it irritates their eyes and nasal passages, making it more likely that they will catch a cold.

What to do if your child gets a cold

No treatment will cure a cold or make it go away more quickly, but you can help your child feel more comfortable:

- ⇒ Rest: This need not be in bed.
- ⇒ **Provide extra drinks**: If your child doesn't want to drink much, try giving lots of small sips of water, milk or juice, or ice blocks to suck for older children.




